Partnership with Marshall University Center of Excellence

Working toward *Intermediate Purveyor* status for both Wraparound and CMCRS (MRSS):

A group of individuals acting as an intermediary between two or more entities to promote the implementation of model programs with fidelity and good effect. The COE has a broader role to promote implementation including building the capacity of providers or systems to implement and sustain best practice models.

COE supports, conducts, and/or oversees organizational and community readiness, initial and ongoing implementation activities, quality and outcome monitoring, and sustainability and “scaling up” efforts for the EBP or promising practice under the guidance established by the purveyor organization.

Implementation Science is...

“the scientific study of methods to promote the systematic uptake of research findings and other EBPs into routine practice, and, hence, to improve the quality and effectiveness of health services.”






System Transformation




